

This beautiful setting is a scenic one hour drive north of the San Diego metropolitan area near Lake Henshaw, Warner Springs, and the historic town of Julian. This rare and pristine property is presently used as a weekend get-a-way and is shown by appointment only.

A small, rustic cabin is hidden in the forest only a few minutes behind a locked gate off of East Grade Road through beautiful Will Valley. A strong spring with clean water is a huge plus. This area of Santa Ysabel-Palomar Mountain relies on solar power. The nearest neighbors are large parcels of land with high-quality custom built homes on those parcels which have dwellings.

There are several vantage points offering views in every direction. The amazing views to the south and east are unrivaled anywhere in the county. The highest point in the county, Hot Springs Mountain (6,533') rises in contrast to the vast open Lake Henshaw basin.

The allure of this incredible property is the variety and relatively undisturbed presence of plant and animal life on site and in the surrounding area. 





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AGRICULTURAL USE REGULATIONS

A70 LIMITED AGRICULTURAL USE REGULATIONS

2700 INTENT.

The provisions of Section 2700 through Section 2709 inclusive, shall be known as the A70 Limited Agricultural Use Regulations. The A70 Use Regulations are intended to create and preserve areas intended primarily for agricultural crop production. Additionally, a limited number of small farm animals may be kept and agricultural products raised on the premises may be processed. Typically, the A70 Use Regulations would be applied to areas throughout the County to protect moderate to high quality agricultural land.

- 1. Dogs and cats not constituting a kennel are accessory uses subject to the Accessory Use Regulations commencing at Section 6150
- On land subject to the "S" and "T" Animal Designators, grazing of horses, bovine animals and sheep permitted provided no buildings, structure, pen or corral shall be designated or used for housing or concentrated feeding of animals, and the number of such animals shall not exceed 1 animal per ½ acre of land.
- One wild or undomesticated animal, kept or maintained in conformance with State and local requirements, is an accessory use subject to the Accessory Use Regulations commencing at Section 6150, and is not subject to the Animal Schedule. (Amended by Ordinance Number 7432 (N.S.) adopted January 6, 1988.)
- 4. The Animal Schedule does not apply to small animals, specialty animals, dogs or cats which are kept for sale in zones where the Retail Sales, General Use type is permitted provided that all activities are conducted entirely within an enclosed building, the building is completely soundproof, there are no outside runs or cages, no boarding of animals, no outside trash containers and no offensive odors.
- Chinchillas are considered small animals except that a MUP may be approved for more than 25 chinchillas on property with the "L" Designator.
- 6. The number of animals allowed is per legal lot.
- Beekeeping must be located at least 600 feet from any habitable dwelling unit, other than such dwelling unit owned by the person owning the apiary.

3112 ANIMAL ENCLOSURE SETBACK TABLE.

Notwithstanding the provisions of an applicable setback designator, enclosures containing the animal-related use types listed in Section 3110 shall have the minimum setbacks specified in the Animal Enclosure Setback Table. The Animal Enclosure Setback Table is incorporated into this section, and all references to this section shall include references to it. Animals subject to the Animal Setback Table must be confined within the appropriate enclosure.
