TRACT ONE:

A 220.66 acre tract of land situated within the E. Roddy Survey, Abstract No. 804, Comanche County, Texas, being those same tracts of land described as Tract No. 1 and Tract No. 2 in a Deed of Life Estate to Kerwin B. Stephens recorded in Volume 917, Page 257, of said Deed Records and in the common line between said Roddy Survey and the S. A. Atkinson Survey, Abstract No. 1530, Comanche County, Texas as recited in Volume 917, Page 257, of said Deed Records; from which a 2 ½" pipe post (control monument) found for the Southwest corner of said Stephens tract bears S 19° 06' 50" W, a distance of 30.30 feet;

Thence N 72° 27' 15" W, 4543.63 feet generally along a fence and along the common line between said Roddy Survey and Atkinson Survey, same being the South line of said Stephens tract and this described tract, to a 3" pipe post (control monument) found for a common corner between said Stephens tract and a tract of land described in a deed to Shack Bennett Cashen, Trustee of the Shack Bennett Cashen 2002 Trust recorded in Volume 882, Page 10, of said Deed Records, said point being located in the common line between said Roddy Survey and Atkinson Survey as recited in Volume 882, Page 10, of said Deed Records;

Thence N 17° 12' 54" E, 1978.57 feet along the common line between said Stephens tract and Cashen tract, to a 3" pipe post (control monument) found for a common corner between said Stephens tract, Cashen tract and a tract of land described in a deed to R. P. Carter, et ux recorded in Volume 319, Page 15, of said Deed Records; from which a ½" rebar rod with survey cap stamped PFINGSTEN 4405 (control monument) found for the Northwest corner of said Carter tract bears N 17° 02' 15" E, a distance of 1269.80 feet;

Thence S 73° 05' 00" E along the common line between said Stephens tract and Carter tract, passing a 4" pipe post (control monument) found for reference at a distance of 2900.66 feet; thence continuing along the same course for a total distance of 2917.42 feet, to a ½" rebar rod set with survey cap stamped ALS 6224 6332 for a common corner between said Stephens tract and Carter tract, same being an interior corner of this described tract;

Thence N 19° 13' 30" E, 263.48 feet continuing along the common line between said Stephens tract and Carter tract, to a ½' rebar rod set with survey cap stamped ALS 6224 6332 for a common corner between said Stephens tract and a tract of land described in a deed to Harold H. Miller, et ux recorded in Volume 750, Page 329, of said Deed Records, same being an angle corner of this described tract; from which a 4" pipe post (control monument) found for reference bears N 72° 52' 36" W, a distance of 18.09 feet;

Thence S 72° 52' 36" E along the common line between said Stephens tract and Miller tract, passing a 4" pipe post (control monument) found for reference at a distance of 1680.65 feet; thence continuing along the same course for a total distance of 1692.72 feet, to a ½" rebar rod set with survey cap stamped ALS 6224 6332 for a common corner between said Stephens tract and Miller tract, said point being located in the West line of previously mentioned Stephens tract; from which a 36" Live Oak tree (control monument) found for the Northwest corner of said Stephens tract bears N 19° 06' 50" E, a distance of 627.09 feet;

Thence S 19° 06' 50" W, 2287.27 feet along the common line between said Stephens tracts, same being the East line of this described tract, to the place of beginning and containing 220.66 acres of land.

Thence along the common line between said Stephens tract and County Road No. 328, same being the North line of this described tract the following courses and distances:

- S 72° 06' 50" E, 1587.70 feet, to a ½" rebar rod set with survey cap stamped ALS 6224 6332 for an angle corner of said Stephens tract and this described tract;
- S 69° 57' 50" E, 473.50 feet, to a ½" rebar rod set with survey cap stamped ALS 6224 6332 for an angle corner of said Stephens tract and this described tract;

S 72° 16' 40" E, 397.76 feet, to a 4" pipe post (control monument) found for a common corner between said Stephens tract and a tract of land described in a deed to Edward Lee "Bud" Davidson and Wanda Jeanne Davidson Revocable Living Trust recorded in Volume 814, Page 463, of said Deed Records, same being the Northeast corner of this described tract;
