Applegate Cove Marina is a full service marina providing boaters on Kerr Lake and the McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System (MKARNS) with fuel, marine maintenance and marine supplies. Our Facilities are located 8 miles south of Sallisaw, Oklahoma on U.S. Highway 59, and then 3 miles west via a paved county road. Our location on the MKARNS is Mile Marker 340, or 340 miles upstream from the Mississippi River and via the Mississippi an additional 599 miles from the Gulf of Mexico.



Applegate Marina is just a 15 minute drive south of Interstate 40 which allows high speed access to Oklahoma City (165 miles), Tulsa (90 miles), Little Rock (165 miles) and the Dallas

- Fort Worth metroplex (266 miles). Additionally, airports in Sallisaw, Fort Smith, AR, and Tulsa, OK provide cruisers with access to air transportation when needed.

We pride ourselves on being "Oklahoma's Outlet to the Sea" and have had the pleasure of assisting untold numbers of cruisers in preparing their vessels for the trip downstream. We service both power and sailing vessels, and as you can tell when visiting our <u>Marine Services</u> page, we offer a wide array of services to aid the yachtsman in preparing for or recovering from their river journey.

Kerr Lake was formed by an impoundment on the Arkansas River south of Sallisaw. It serves as a pool elevation lake for the McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System (MKARNS), helping to ensure navigable water levels downstream. The <u>Arkansas River Historical Society</u> maintains a web site that provides a brief, yet informative, history of the river and the surrounding areas and is worth the visit. Additionally, they provide a historical reference for the construction of the navigation system.



Tenants and cruisers will find an area steeped in history, Native American culture, wildlife sanctuaries, and scenic beauty. Attractions such as, "Hangin Judge Parker's" courthouse in Fort Smith, historic downtown Van Buren, the Cherokee National Capitol in Tahlequah, are but a few of the locations available for the cruiser to while away the hours. Fort Smith and Van Buren are an easy day's run via the navigation channel, and cruisers will find a variety of events sponsored by the City of Fort Smith including a 4th of July fireworks display, The Riverfront Blues Festival, and other events held on the river front. There is an excellent anchorage just across the channel from the river park, and the City of Fort Smith is in the process of completing a four million dollar riverfront upgrade project. The Cherokee Capitol and Heritage site in Tahlequah are an hour away via ground transportation, and for cruisers interested in Native American History, well worth the drive.


Geographically speaking, Kerr Lake is located in the broad Arkansas River plain. The Cookson Hills of eastern Oklahoma rise to the north, and extend to the northeast forming the Ozark Mountains of northern Arkansas and southern Missouri. While to the south, the Ouachitas rise up from the plain to form the largest expanse of southern forest (over 1 million acres) in the National Forest Service inventory. Both mountain ranges, at some point or another, play tag with the banks of the Arkansas River to provide a backdrop idyllic for cruisers. Whether one choices a fall foliage trip or spring time blossoms, the peace and serenity found along the banks of the river are unparalleled. Bird watcher's need to keep a sharp eye for eagles and osprey as the ply the local waters. In winter, thousands of geese arrive from the north and are easily viewed along your route. Many boaters have come to think of the lake and its secluded coves as their private reserve. For the outdoorsman, the lake and river provide ample fishing, with plenty of local knowledge to show you how to catch the big one.

On those occasions when you are expecting more guests than the boat can accommodate, or a large family gathering, or simply a weekend on the water without "roughing it", we invite you to stay in our beautiful lake front cottage. Actually, it's "ON" the lake, and sleeps six adults in three queens size beds (linens furnished*). The galley comes fully equipped and the Gas BBQ grill on deck awaits your favorite summertime fare.

* While there is ample room for additional guests, linens are only furnished for six.





As you can see in the above pictures, the cottage offers immediate water access. Just pull your boat along side, and load or unload passengers, lunches, and gear. After your day on the water, secure your dock lines, and relax in air conditioned comfort, and if mother nature allows, you'll enjoy one of the most beautiful sunsets anywhere. Reservations are not required but are probably a good idea, and we have provided our <u>contact information</u> to aid you in this process or just call 918-775-4522 to check availability. Cabin rates are \$120 for party of two and \$140 for a party of four with room for additional guests.

For the more adventurous, there are three Corps of Engineer campgrounds on Kerr Lake, one of which is just around the corner (and even named Applegate Cove CG). These sites include full hook for RV's, as well as, tent sites. For those who are not aware, the Corps has gone to a reservation system for camp sites, and this can be done online by accessing the Corps of Engineers Reservation page. In addition to the Corps' sites, Lakeside RV Park is located 7 miles south of Sallisaw on U.S. Highway 59 (and only minutes from the marina) and is a Coast to Coast Campground Affiliate. Clean and well maintained, Lakeside offers excellent access to the lake and the river. It even has a large pool for guests.



Cruising Guides





The McClellan - Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System is a side trip up the Arkansas River for 445 miles. The system meanders through the Arkansas and Oklahoma country sides until reaching the end of navigation at Tulsa's Port of Catoosa. The only guide to the system is Bruce and Joyce Johnson's Arkansas River Cruise Guide. We were fortunate to have the Johnson's as tenants prior to their beginning a Great Circle Cruise. Their guide includes chartlets and identifies anchorages which they scouted during their cruise of the Arkansas River system. This publication is

available from numerous sources including Applegate Marina.

Once you have reached the Mississippi River you'll have a decision to make. Cruisers can proceed downstream to New Orleans, or head upstream entering the Great Circle Route via the Ohio River. Either way, the Gulf of Mexico awaits and provides the cruiser with opportunities for both local and exotic landfalls. Additional guides to the Great Circle Route are shown below, and while we have copies of Quimby's Guide, all are available for Bluewater Books & Charts, as well as other fine e-merchants.







Another consideration for any cruise on the Arkansas River would be stream flow. One

site which provides meaningful data is the U. S. Army Corps of Engineer, <u>Little Rock District</u>. This site presents information covering the entire system in tabular form. Furthermore, it offers forecast river flow in cubic feet per second (ft³/sec). Data concerning the Mississippi River and forecast flow are available from the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, <u>Memphis District</u>. Additional information on river flow is available via the National Weather Service Radio, which announces forecast river flows as a part of its weather information broadcast, but typically just for the next day.



Navigation Information

The United States Army Corps of Engineers furnishes online versions of their <u>Arkansas</u> and Mississippi Rivers Navigation charts. This link, <u>Mississippi River PDF Chart instructions</u>, will take you to an instructional page for the Mississippi River where you can also download free PDF charts. Just follow the instructions and you're done. These charts are smaller versions of those published by the Corps, but contain all the necessary navigational informational for transiting both rivers <u>AND ARE FREE</u>. Both of the above charts are widely available in printed form. If you need one drop us a note and we'll see to it that your request is promptly shipped.

And last but not least The U. S. Coast Guard's <u>Local Notice to Mariners</u> is available online. The Arkansas River falls under the 8th District/Western Rivers which administrators the Mississippi River and its tributaries. A complete listing LNM's, as well as, archived files from previous years may be viewed or downloaded at this site. Considering commercial traffic volume, and Spring - Fall flooding within the Mississippi Basin, this site might be well worth checking prior to navigating a particular river or section of river.

We will continue to look for information regarding navigation of the Arkansas River. And as we find new and interesting sites, we update this page for you benefit. If our staff can be of any service to you during the preparation phase of your river odyssey please do not hesitate to contact us.
