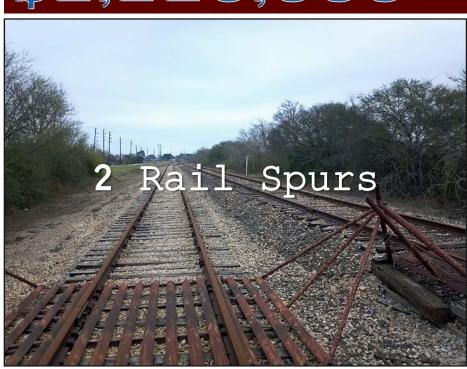

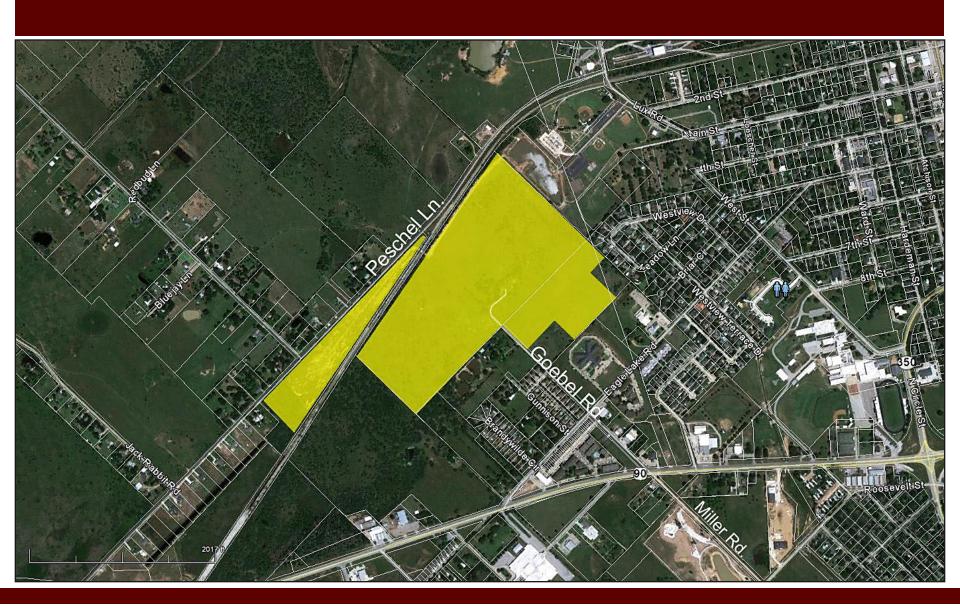

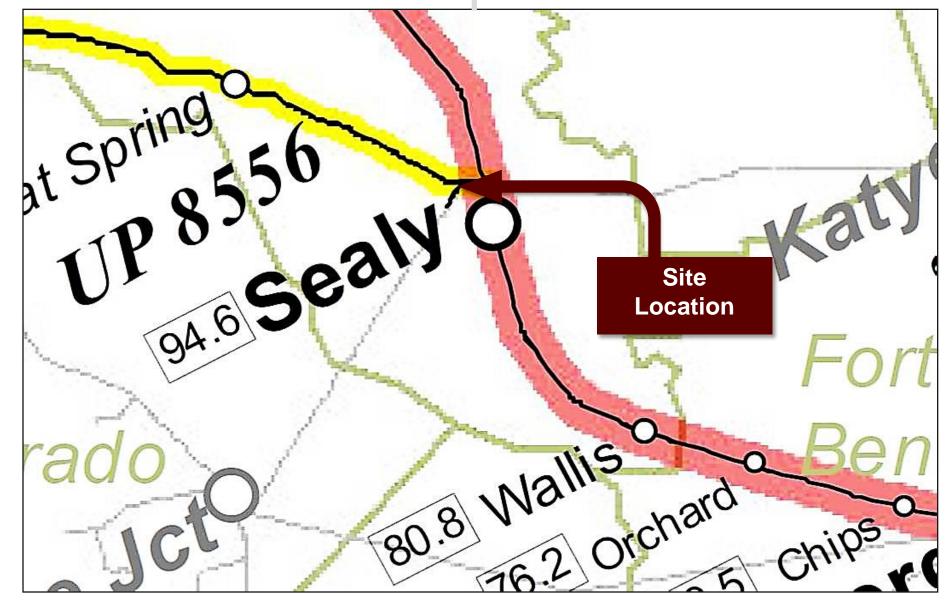

efore working with a real estate broker, you should know that the duties of a broker depend on whom the broker represents. If you are a prospective a buyer's agent represents the buyer. A broker may act as parties consent in writing.
