

Location





Princeton is located in Collin County, six miles east of McKinney, 42 miles north of downtown Dallas, 44 miles from DFW International Airport, and 41 miles from Dallas Love Field. Collin County is the fastest growing large county in Texas and the McKinney/Princeton area is one of the fastest growing parts of Collin County.



Collin County Regional Airport is less than four miles from the center of Princeton. This airport is one the largest corporate flight centers in the Dallas-Fort Worth area.


Area Attractions/Events

Lake Lavon

Princeton is located on the north shore of Lake Lavon, an approximately 21,400 acre reservoir formed by a dam on the East Fork of the Trinity River. Four major park areas are located along the lake shore in the Princeton area. These parks provide camping, picnic areas, and swimming facilities. The lake is used extensively for fishing and all types of water recreation activities.

Princeton Spring Onion Festival
