Unless otherwise specified herein, the covenants To Red and Conshall apply to Lots 1-58, Shorewood Heights Addition to the City of Menomonie, Dunn County, Wisconsin.

2. Land Use. No lot shall be used except for residential purposes; no buildings shall be erected, altered, placed or permitted to remain on any lot other than one single family dwelling and a private garage for not more than three cars.

3. Mobile Homes. No trailer, mobile home or double-wide modular home shall be placed on the above-described property, neither as real estate nor as personal property.

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DECLARATION OF COVENANTS AND RESTRICTIONS

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THIS DECLARATION is made this 26th day of May, 1992, by the undersigned OWNERS ("OWNERS").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, The Owners of the real property described in paragraph 1 of this Declaration, are desirous of subjecting the real property described in said paragraph 1 to the covenants, conditions, restrictions and reservations hereinafter set forth for the benefit of the said property as a whole and for the benefit of each owner of any part thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, Owners hereby declare that the real property hereinafter described shall be used, held, transferred, sold and conveyed subject to the covenants, conditions, restrictions and reservations hereinafter set forth, which shall inure to the benefit of and pass with said property, and each and every parcel thereof, and shall apply to and bind all successors in interest, and any owner thereof.

1. <u>Property Subject To This Declaration</u>. The following property shall be subject to this Declaration:

Lots 64, 65, 56, 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77 and 78, Second Addition to Shorewood Heights; and Lots 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85 and Outlots 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10, Third Addition to Shorewood Heights. All in 7 Site of Monorania Country of New States 5 Minutes. City of Menomonie, County of Dunn, State of Wisconsin. (Lot 86 of Third Addition to Shorewood Heights is not subject to this declaration.)

2. <u>General Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Declaration is to insure the best use and most appropriate development and improvement of lots; to protect owners of lots against such use of surrounding building sites as will detract from the residential value of their property; to preserve, so far as practicable, the natural beauty of said property; to guard against the erection thereon of poorly designed, built or proportioned structures; to obtain harmonious use of material and color schemes; and in general to provide adequately for a high quality of improvement on said property and thereby to preserve and enhance the value of investments made by purchasers of lots.

3. <u>Lend Use.</u> No lot shall be used except for single family residential purposes; and no buildings shall be erected, altered, placed or permitted to remain on any lot other than one single family dwelling and a private garage for not more than three cars.
