To get to the north side of the property, turn right on Poole Road (Sumter Co. 543), which crosses Nazarene Church Road 2.9 miles from US 15, and go 0.1 miles to Underwood Road (Sumter Co. 535). Turn left on Underwood Road and go 0.5 miles. Cuttino Tract will be on the left.
