Definition of Core Based Statistical Areas "CBSAs"

Metropolitan statistical areas (metro areas) are geographic entities defined by the <u>U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB)</u> for use by Federal statistical agencies in collecting, tabulating, and publishing Federal statistics.

The term "Core Based Statistical Area" (CBSA) is a collective term for both metro and micro areas:

Metro areas have core of <u>50,000 or more</u> population <u>Micro areas</u> have core of <u>at least 10,000 and less than 50,000</u> population

Each metro or micro area consists of one or more counties and includes the counties containing the core urban area, as well as any adjacent counties that have a high degree of social and economic integration (as measured by commuting to work) with the urban core.








CBSA County specific 2008 population






CBSA County specific 2008-13 annual % population growth






CBSA County specific 2008 total economy






CBSA County specific total economic growth 2008-2013






CBSA County specific 2008-13 annual % economic growth






CBSA County specific 2008 & 2013 density*

* population per square mile






CBSA County specific 2008 & 13 per capita consumer spending






CBSA County specific 2008-13 annual % con. spending growth






CBSA County specific 2008 per capita effective buying income






CBSA County specific 2008-13 annual % growth effective buying income






CBSA County specific 2008 average household income






CBSA County specific 2008-13 annual % growth average household income






CBSA County specific 2008 & 13 % households at least \$100K annual income






CBSA County specific 2008-13 annual % growth households at least \$100K annual income






CBSA County specific 2008 & 13 % households at least \$150K annual income






CBSA County specific 2008-13 annual % growth households at least \$150K annual income






CBSA County specific 2008 & 13 % households at least \$250K annual income






CBSA County specific 2008-13 annual % growth households at least \$250K annual income






CBSA County specific 2008 # of employers






CBSA County specific 2008 # of employees






CBSA County specific 2008 % of residents employed






CBSA County specific 2008 # residents per business






CBSA County specific 2008 # households per business
