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# INFORMATION REGARDING THE REAL ESTATE SELLER DISCLOSURE LAW

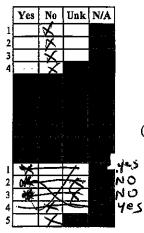

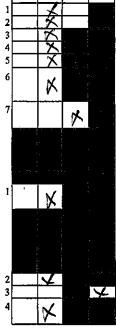
