LOCATION:

PICK RANCH: Located just outside of Boyd, Montana, with the splendor of the Beartooth Mountains in the back drop. The Absaroka-Beartooths are ancient mountains now protected by a wilderness area of the same name. These ranges start in south-central Montana southeast of Bozeman and run south into Yellowstone National Park. The Beartooth Highway bisects the mountains along the Montana-Wyoming border providing spectacular views while reaching an elevation of 10,947 at Beartooth Pass. There are ample opportunities for outdoor recreation here with numerous trails, lakes, and campgrounds.

BOYD: Boyd is a small agricultural town halfway between (approximately 23 miles) Red Lodge and Laurel. It is the gateway to the Cooney Reservoir State Park, the most popular recreation area in Southcentral Montana. The park is open year round and features good walleye and rainbow trout fishing, boating opportunities, and there are five campgrounds around the lake. During the winter months, Cooney State Park is a great place to ice fish and cross country ski.

BILLINGS: Located approximately 41 miles to the northeast, Billings is the center of Montana's livestock industry. The International Airport in Billings is presently serviced by 5 majors airlines. Billings has two of the finest medical facilities in the northwest. Shopping, fine dining, theater and the arts make Billings the true hub of Montana.

RED LODGE: Red Lodge, just 23 miles away, is a resort and ranching community with a colorful coal-mining past that looks onto 28 peaks rising over 12,000 feet. This charming alpine town is nestled in the foothills of the magnificent Beartooth Mountains and is surrounded by Custer National Forest. The 69-mile Beartooth Scenic Drive has dramatic switchbacks overlooking snow-capped peaks, glaciers, alpine lakes and plateaus. The Beartooth Pass has been described as the most scenic drive in America by CBS news correspondent Charles Kuralt.













Average Climate for Joliet, MT


