Dear Mr. Moreira:

A request was made by the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board to review this site for possible closure. Based on the review of all available information: "Final Report on the UST Removal at Benicia Auto Parts, 800 First Street, Benicia", additional analytical information form Chromalab, Inc (dated July 24, 1990), and with the assumption that the information provided to this agency was accurate and representative of existing conditions, it is the position of this office that no further action is required at this time. This letter confirms the completion of site investigation and remedial action activities for the one 750-gallon waste oil and two 1,000-gallon diesel USTs removed from the above site on July 17, 1990. Enclosed is the Case Closure Summary for the referenced site for your records.

The content of these reports has also been discussed with staff personnel of the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB). Based on the information submitted and current requirements, the RWQCB concurs with the determination of this agency that no further action is required at this time.

Please be advised that this letter does not relieve you of any liability under the California Health and Safety Code or Water Code for past, present, or future operations at the site. Nor does it relieve you of the responsibility to clean up existing, additional or previously unidentified conditions at the site which cause or threaten to cause pollution or nuisance or otherwise pose a threat to water quality or public health.

comments (depth of remediation, etc.):

Initially five soil samples were collected 7-17-90 during UST removal activities. The samples were not analyzed for TPH as diesel but Sample No. 5 was analyzed for total O/G (1200 ppm). Contaminated soil beneath former W/Oil UST was over-excavated and removed from the site. An additional confirmation soil sample was collected (5B) and was less than detection limit O/G (10 ppm). In 9-25-90 an additional sample was collected from the former UST area and analyzed for TPH-Diesel, TPH-gas, BTEX, and halogenated hydrocarbons. None of the analytes were reported at concentrations greater than analytical detection limits. No groundwater was reported during tank removal and soil excavation activities.
