History: This property has been in the Dyer family for generations. The timber on this property has been managed and there was a conservative selective timber removal in 2005. Enclosed in this report is an outline of an estimate of the volume of timber in the residual stand as well as a projection of volume and value for a 15 year rotation harvest.

Coal and Minerals: The Dyer 2/3 interest is being offered in fee. We understand some coal was removed in the 1930s. The area of coal removal is shown on the enclosed USGS Topographic Map. That area has been reclaimed. A representative of the West Virginia Geological Survey verified there are still coal reserves in this area, however, no core drilling or sampling history is available to make a determination as to the quality or amount of coal that remains. No information is available on oil or gas reserves.
