Dear Ms. Woxell:

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has completed its review of the available documents as of April 18, 2014, for the subject property. Based on the information presented in the documents, petroleum hydrocarbon contamination in soil and groundwater was identified at the subject property. The attached summary identifies the nature and status of the contamination detected.

KDHE's evaluation of the available documents for the subject property indicates that petroleum hydrocarbon contamination impacting the subject property is present at levels that do not exceed the KDHE approved risk-based cleanup levels. KDHE has determined that contamination at the subject property does not pose a significant risk to human health or the environment. Therefore, pursuant to Kansas Statutes Annotated 65-34,161 et seq., KDHE declares that No Further Action is necessary at the subject property. This No Further Action determination is issued to Magellan Midstream Partners, LP and extends to its successors and assigns of the subject property. This determination is conditioned upon Magellan Midstream Partners, LP recording in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for Sedgwick County, KDHE's determination summary describing any contamination that may be remaining at the subject property, the enclosed legal map showing property boundaries, and this letter containing KDHE's No Further Action determination.

An affidavit (form enclosed) indicating that the enclosures have been attached to the property deed must be returned to KDHE prior to termination of the Voluntary Agreement.

The Chase Gasoline Spill, 69th & Webb, Wichita property is located at the intersection of 69th Street and Webb Road, Wichita, Sedgwick County, Kansas. The site encompasses over 13 acres located within a pipeline right-of-way and on adjacent agricultural properties. Some of the product pipelines have been in place for several decades.

According to the Corrective Action Study document dated December 7, 1998, the following historic information was obtained. In June 1994, a release of refined gasoline occurred from a 10-inch product pipeline at the southwest corner of 69th Street and Webb Road (north of Wichita). Corrosion caused the failure of the pipeline owned by the Chase Pipeline Company and operated by the Chase Transportation Division. An estimated amount of 75,000 gallons of gasoline was released. Vacuum trucks were used to collect excess product from the impacted roadway drainage ditches. Emergency spill response included excavation of impacted soil, replacement of the corroded section of pipeline, and moving a rural water line away from the impacted areas.

During the initial spill response, soil samples were collected to characterize the immediate extent of contamination and to guide excavation efforts. If the soil contained greater than 100 milligrams per kilograms of total petroleum hydrocarbon gasoline range organics (TPH-GRO), then impacted soil was removed and landfarmed nearby. Groundwater samples were collected from boreholes beneath the release area and ditches. The data indicated groundwater was impacted.

In June 1994, groundwater was collected from three domestic wells in the relative vicinity of the site. Water samples were also collected from the rural water system. Analytical results from the domestic wells and the rural water system indicated no petroleum hydrocarbon detections. In August 1994, four monitoring wells were installed.

On May 22, 1995, Chase Pipeline Company entered into an agreement with the Kansas Department of Health and Environment's State Cooperative Program (Consent Order 95-E-0027) to conduct a Comprehensive Investigation and Corrective Action Study on the area impacted by the catastrophic pipeline failure. A monitoring program was developed and implemented. A Corrective Action Decision (CAD) was signed in 2001 after the required public notice was published.

On November 29, 2001, Equiva Services, LLC and KDHE entered into a Voluntary Agreement (#01VCP0042) to address petroleum impacts. The site was concurrently transferred from the State Cooperative Program to the Voluntary Cleanup and Property Redevelopment Program (VCPRP). A mutual decision was made to implement the chosen remedial alternative from the previously approved CAD. The remedial options originally set forth in the CAD included monitored natural attenuation (MNA) and placing institutional controls on the property.

The pipeline was later acquired by Magellan Midstream Partners, L.P. (Magellan). The original Voluntary Agreement with Equiva Services, LLC was terminated and on December 29, 2004, a new Voluntary Agreement (#04VCP0042) was executed between Magellan and KDHE.


Groundwater monitoring was conducted at the site for several years. MNA parameters such as dissolved oxygen, total alkalinity, chloride, nitrate, sulfate, sulfate, etc. were also collected in addition to petroleum hydrocarbon parameters. Contamination gradually decreased until only one monitoring well (MW-8) remained impacted.


In March 2007, KDHE approved a work plan for an interim remedial measure to address low levels of benzene contamination in MW-8. The short-term remedy consisted of operating a portable soil vapor extraction/air sparging (SVE/AS) unit at MW-8 where benzene persisted at levels just above cleanup standards. Prior to implementation, Magellan concluded that SVE/AS would not be effective. Instead, in situ Submerged Oxygen Curtain (iSOC®) technology or a limited excavation was suggested. But after additional consideration, these ideas were also discarded by Magellan. Ultimately, it was decided to place an Environmental Use Control (EUC) on the subject property to address residual groundwater impacts. However, this option failed due to landowner concerns. Monitoring continued in its place as the contamination appeared to be naturally attenuating.


The recalcitrant MW-8 was redeveloped prior to sampling in the summer of 2009. For two more years, routine sampling detected benzene at levels that were periodically above cleanup standards in MW-8. During the period of March 2011 to March 2013, semi-annual monitoring data indicated no detections of petroleum hydrocarbons. Groundwater was determined as meeting cleanup criteria.

In November 2013, all of the remaining monitoring wells relating to the Chase Gasoline Spill, 69th & Webb, Wichita site were properly plugged and abandoned.

KDHE has determined that any residual petroleum hydrocarbon soil impacts at the subject property are insignificant and that all requirements for the Voluntary Cleanup and Property Redevelopment Program have been met. Thus, a "No Further Action" determination based upon insignificant contamination is recommended for the subject property.
