


One of these springs, located on the northern border next to the forest service, creates a picturesque small creek.

The terrain of this remarkable property ranges from flat to hilly, adorned with majestic pine trees and ash draws teeming with dense underbrush.







Additionally, the seller expresses interest in leasing back the grazing rights, but only after the hunting season.

Alongside the adjacent crop ground, this ranch forms an ideal habitat for abundant wildlife, including deer, elk, turkeys, and pheasants


























Ekalaka
