The following resolution was made by TOM BACKEVS and seconded by Albert Keyes, to wit:
Recitals

A. On April 18, 2000, the Clearwater Township Board passed the Clearwater Township Iron Bridge Resolution which provided:

> CLEARWATER TOWNSHIP hereby accepts jurisdiction of the portion of Glade [Valley] Road/Kellogg Road as offered by the Kalkaska County Road Commission. The township supervisor and township clerk are authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to facilitate the transfer or jurisdiction over the property. Further, the township supervisor and township clerk are authorized to increase the township's liability policy as necessary to cover the potential liabilities due to jurisdiction over the property as the township's insurance agents may deem advisable.

- B. On November 19, 2019, the Clearwater Township Board closed the Old Iron Bridge to vehicular traffic due to its deteriorating and unsafe condition.
- C. Michael and Catherine Stevens are the owners of the property where the roadway and Old Iron Bridge are located. They are also the owners of the only house which requires crossing over the Old Iron Bridge for safe and convenient vehicular access.
- D. Michael and Catherine Stevens have executed a Declaration of Easement pursuant to which the public's right of ingress and egress to the Rapid River at this location has been preserved and enhanced.
- E. MCL 224.18(8) requires that a township seeking to transfer the property or jurisdiction over the property must give the Department of Natural Resources first priority to obtain the property or jurisdiction over the property.

F. The Clearwater Township Board complied with MCL 224.18(8) and the Department of Natural Resources declined their opportunity to obtain the property or jurisdiction over the property. December 17, 2020 email from the Department of Natural Resources attached hereto as Exhibit A.

I can check with staff and have them provide some thoughts/feedback on this. Do you have a map, location and name of the road that you are referencing that you could provide?

Would it be possible to provide us with a copy of the easement in which the property owner is granting the easement to the township as well? It would be helpful in getting feedback from our various staff/divisions.

And lastly, you reference that the attorney for the private owners contacted the DNR prior to the settlement and had at least some indication that the DNR did not want ownership. Would you be able to provide the name of that attorney and who he/she believes they talked to in the DNR. It might help us track down more easily the right staff who already looked at this and help speed up the process of a informal review on our side.

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Kelly:

You left me a message last week. I understand from your voicemail that you are working remotely and that email is the best way to contact you. I represent Clearwater Township with respect to property that goes over the Rapid River. The property only leads to one home. The Township was sued by the homeowner and entered into a settlement agreement pursuant to which the homeowner is going to take over ownership of the property (and bridge) and grant an easement to preserve the area as an access point to the river for the general public. The bridge requires costly maintenance which the homeowner has agreed to perform. Our understanding is that we are required to first offer ownership to the DNR and that was also a part of the settlement agreement. Again, our preference is that the DNR will decline ownership, allowing the property to pass to the private owners (again preserving access for the public). I understand from the attorney for the private owners that they contacted the DNR prior to the settlement and had at least some indication that the DNR did not want ownership.
