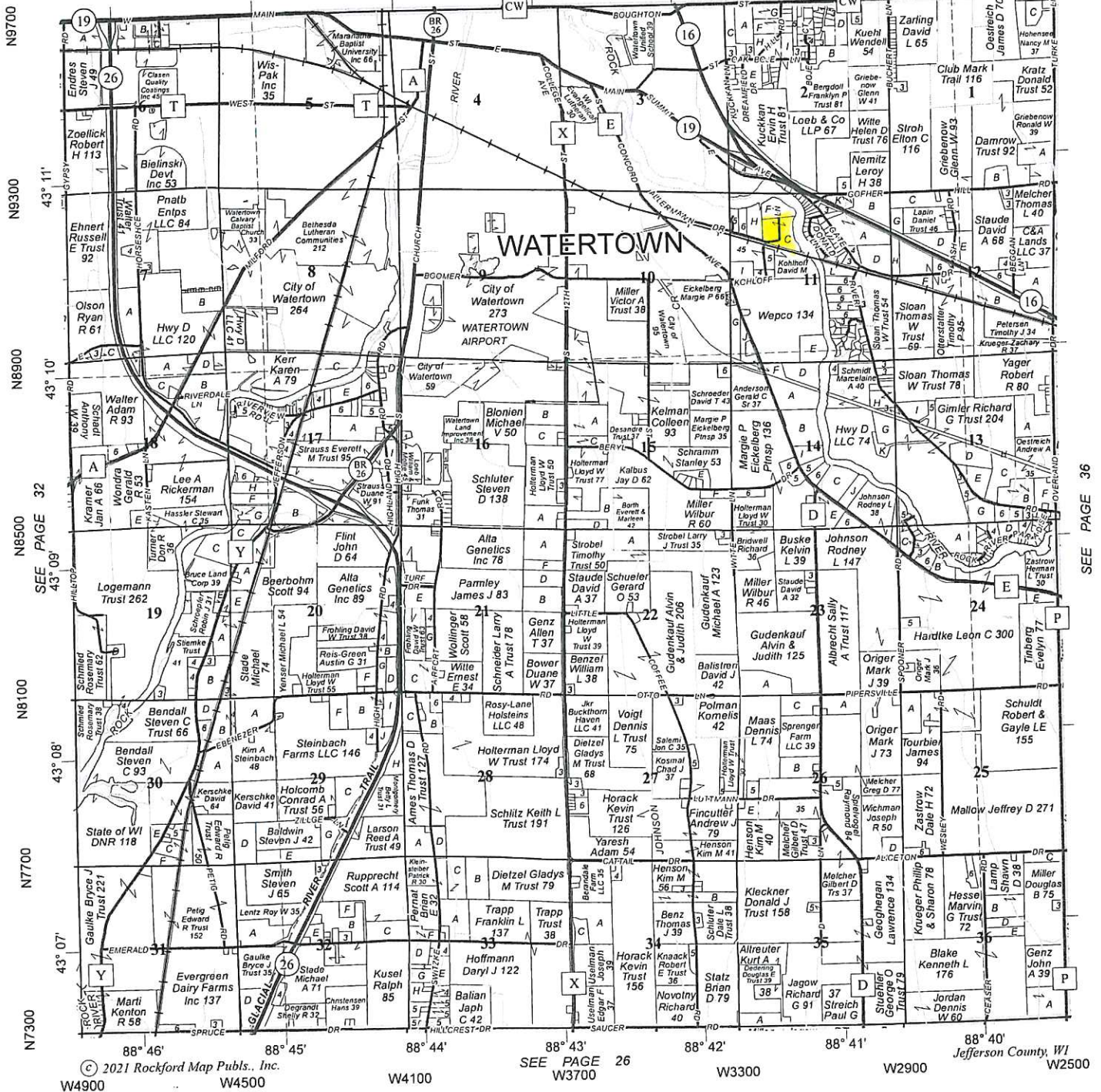


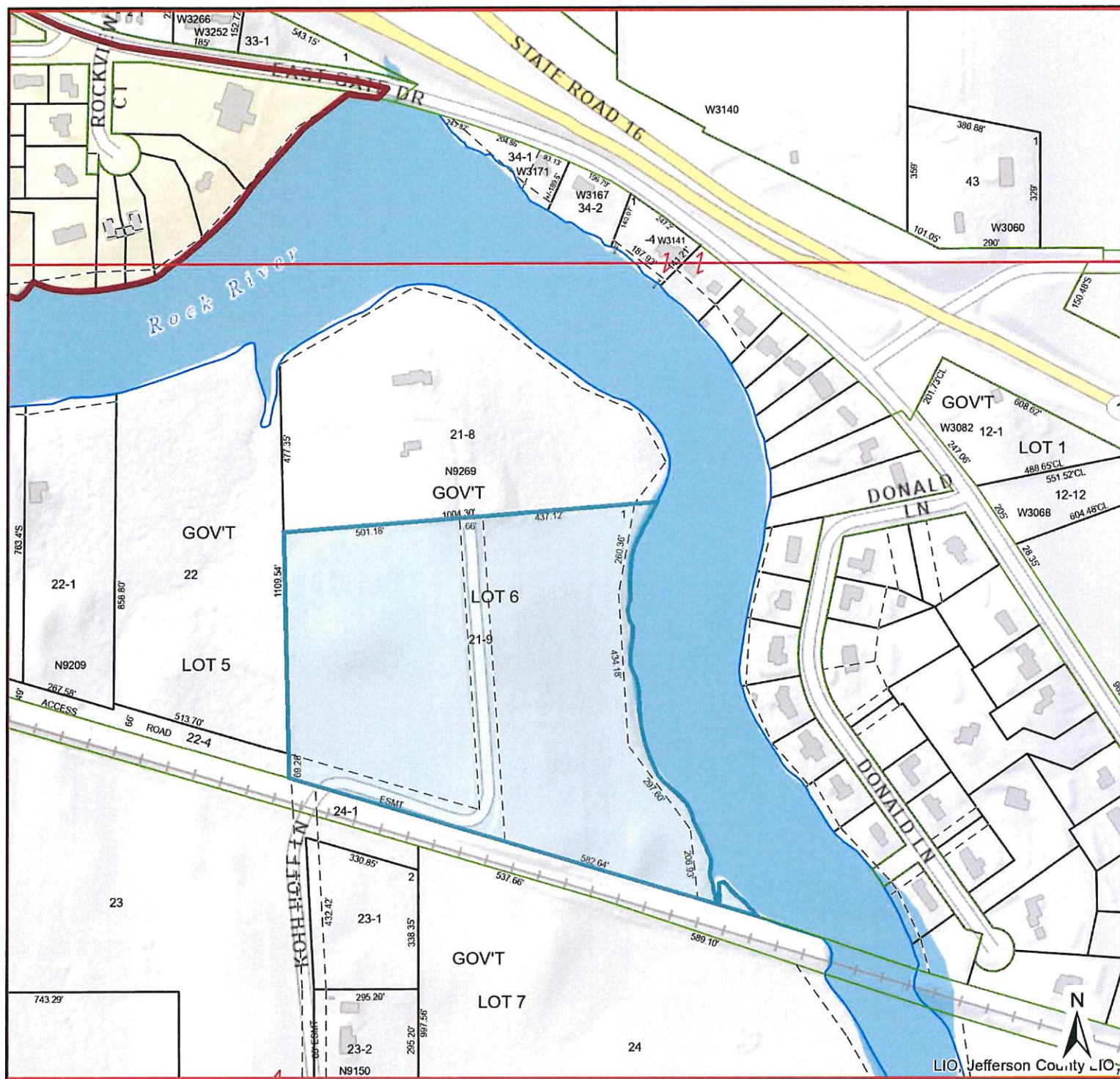

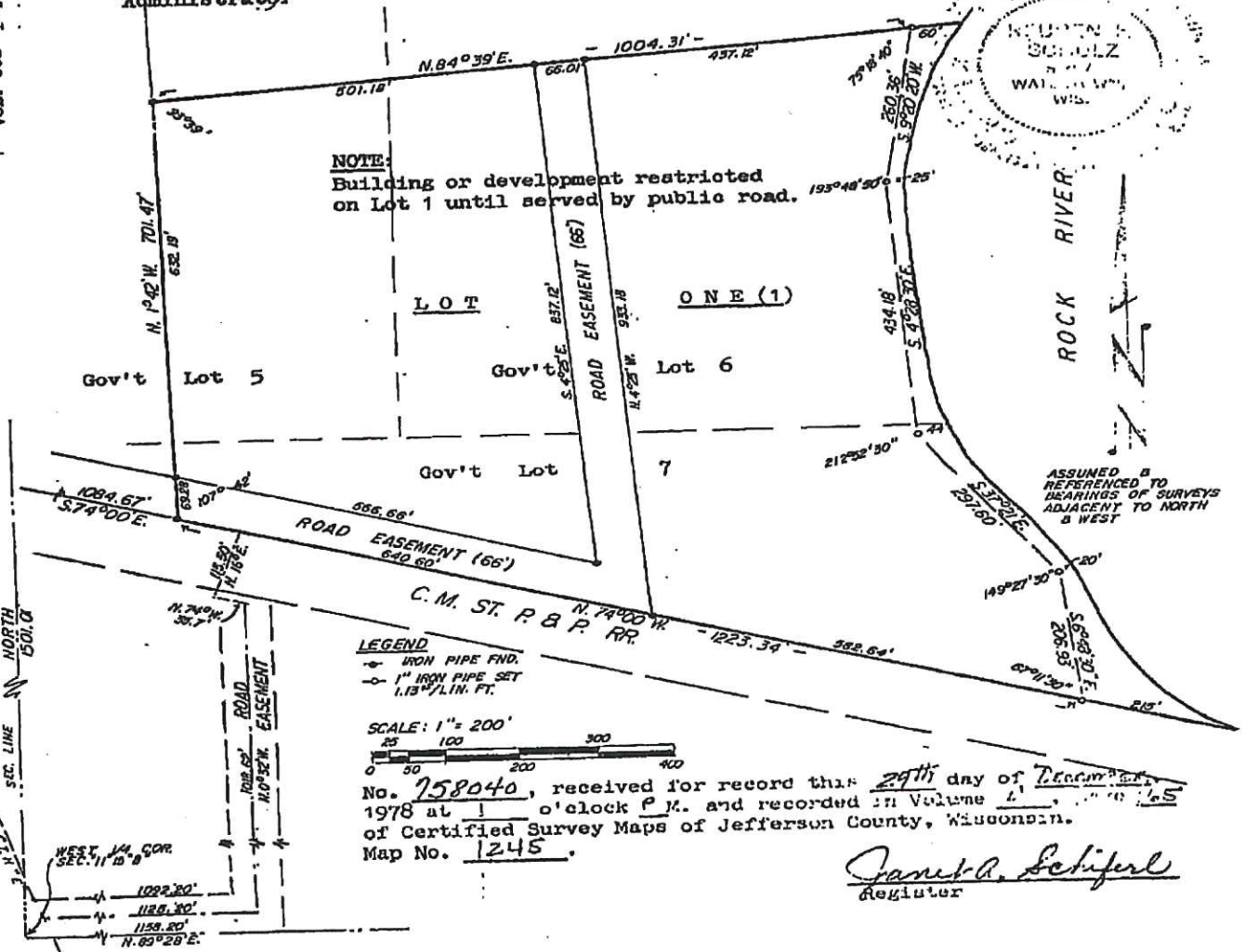
I, Reuben F. Schulz, a Registered Land Surveyor, do hereby certify that I have surveyed and mapped parts of Government Lots 5, 6 & 7 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 11, T.8 N., R.15 E., of the 4th P.M., Town of Watertown, Jefferson County, Wisconsin, described as follows: Commencing at the West 1/4 corner of said Section 11; thence North, along the West line of said Northwest 1/4 of Section 11, 1501.01 feet to the north right-of-way line of the C.M. ST. P. & P. RR.; thence S.74°00'E. along said north right-of-way line, 1084.67 feet to the point of beginning; thence N.1°42'W., 701.47 feet; thence N.84°39'E., 1004.31 feet to a point which is 60 feet more or less from the water's edge of the Rock River; thence along the meander line of the River, S.9°20'20"W., 260.36 feet; thence S.4°28'30"E., 434.18 feet; thence S.37°21'E., 297.60 feet; thence S.6°48'30"E., 206.93 feet to a point which is 215 feet more or less from the water's edge of the Rock River and the end of the meander line, said point being on the north right-of-way line of the C.M. ST. P. & P. RR.; thence N.74°00'W., along said north right-of-way line, 1223.24 feet to the point of beginning including all land lying between the meander line and the water's edge of the Rock River, and containing approximately 21.93 acres.

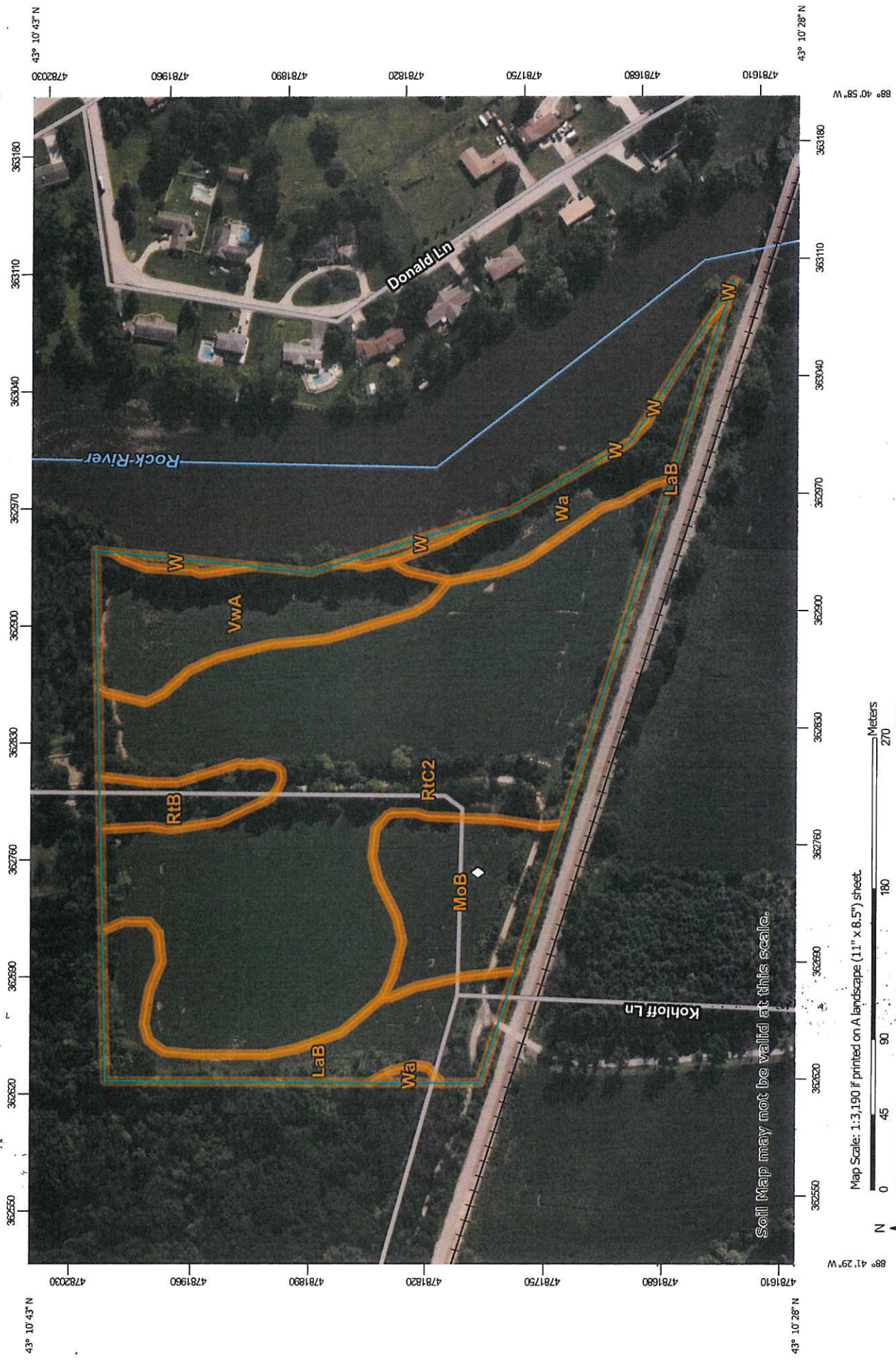

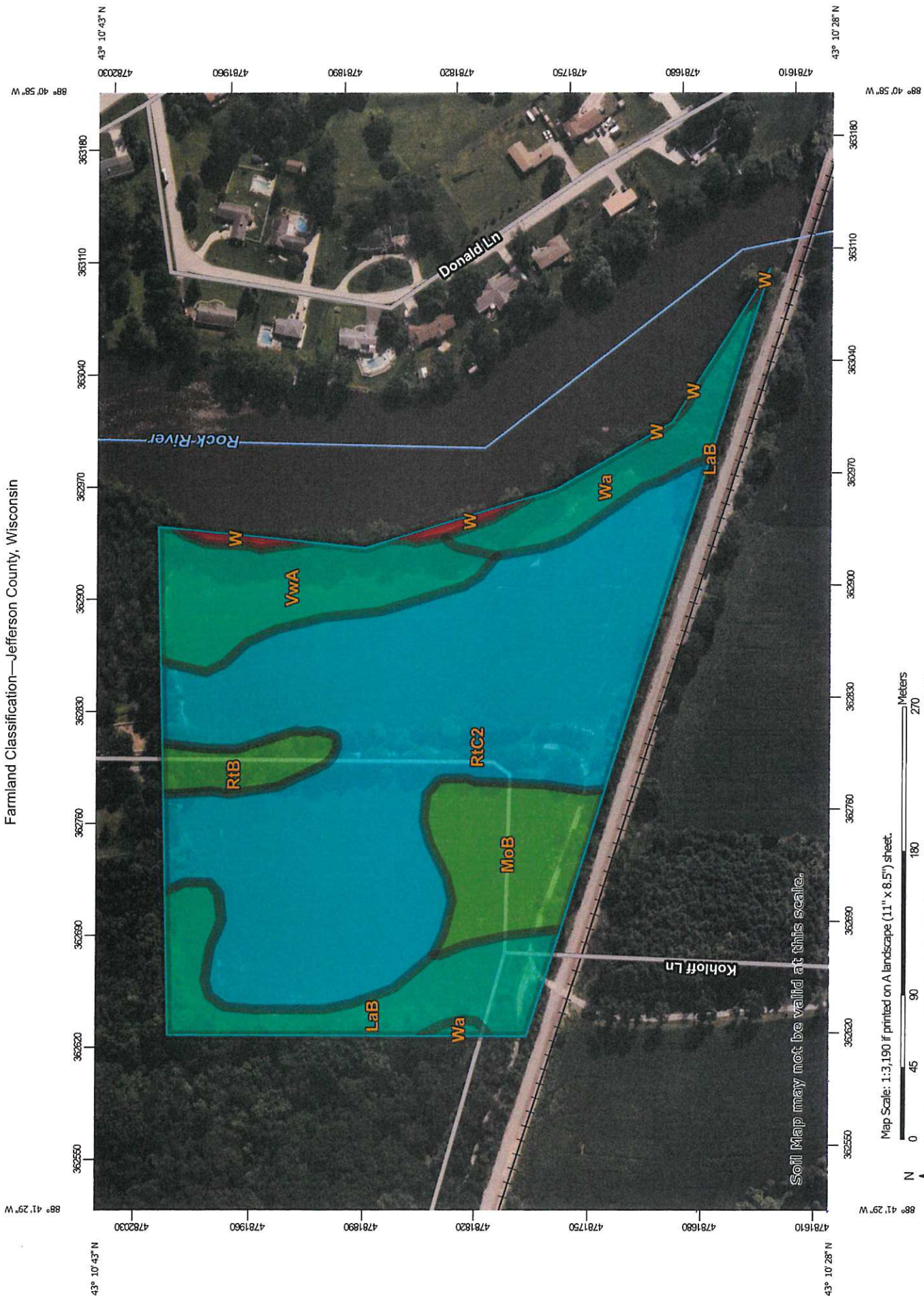

Description
