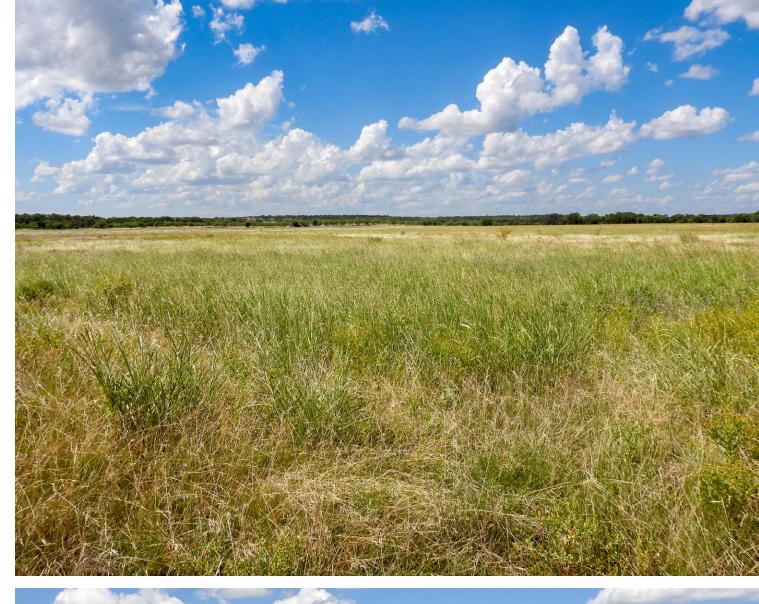




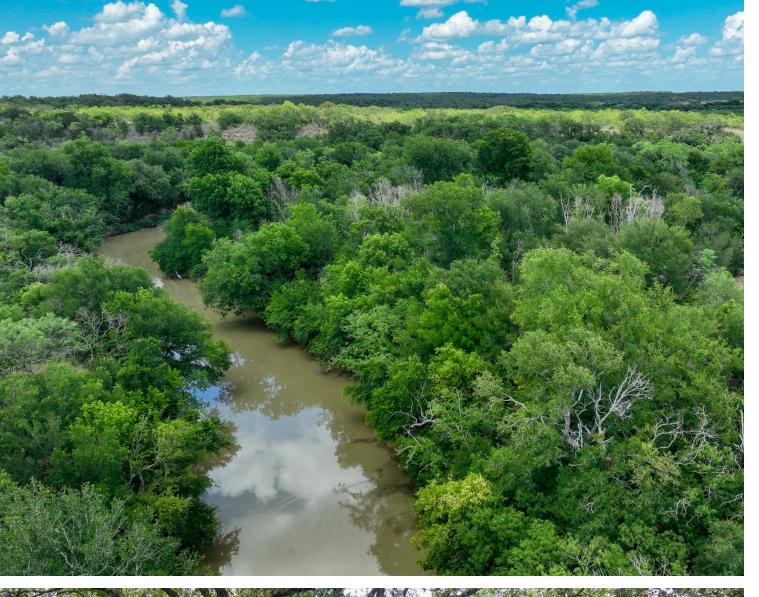
This property offers easy access, lots of live water, coastal bermuda fields, and excellent cover for hunting native wildlife. An exceptional combination of open and rolling meadows, dense canopies, thickets for wildlife, and fertile creek bottoms.

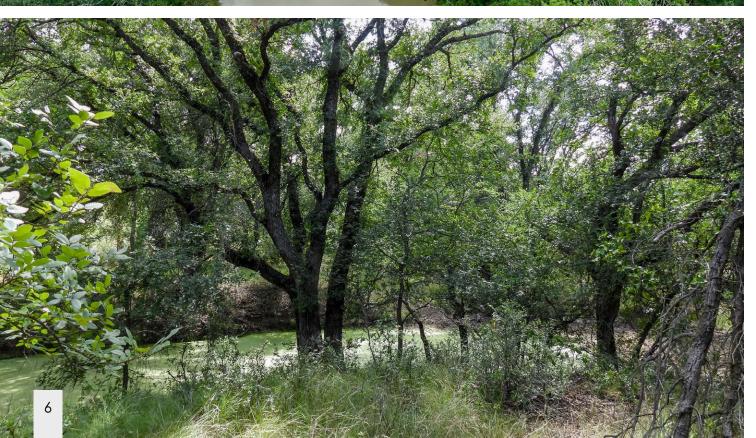
Approximately 134 acres in the central portion of the property has been grubbed and has an excellent turf of native grasses and coastal bermuda. The property has not been grazed in several years and the grass turf overall is in exceptional condition. The southern and northern portions of the ranch offer excellent cover for wildlife with large live oak, post oak, elm, mesquite, and other hardwood trees scattered through the pasture with willows, pecan, and cottonwoods being common along the creeks.











#### Water Features

It can not be overstated that the Curry Pasture of the Warren Ranch has been blessed with an abundance of live water. Jim Ned Creek makes up the northern boundary of the ranch and Watts Creek flows through the southern portion of the property. This is substantial for a property of this size. Coleman County rural water is piped to the property and supplies the house with city water. The ranch also has riparian water rights out of Jim Ned Creek.



# Topography

The ranch's varied topography — from rolling meadows to dense thickets and fertile creek bottoms creates the perfect conditions for four-season recreation.

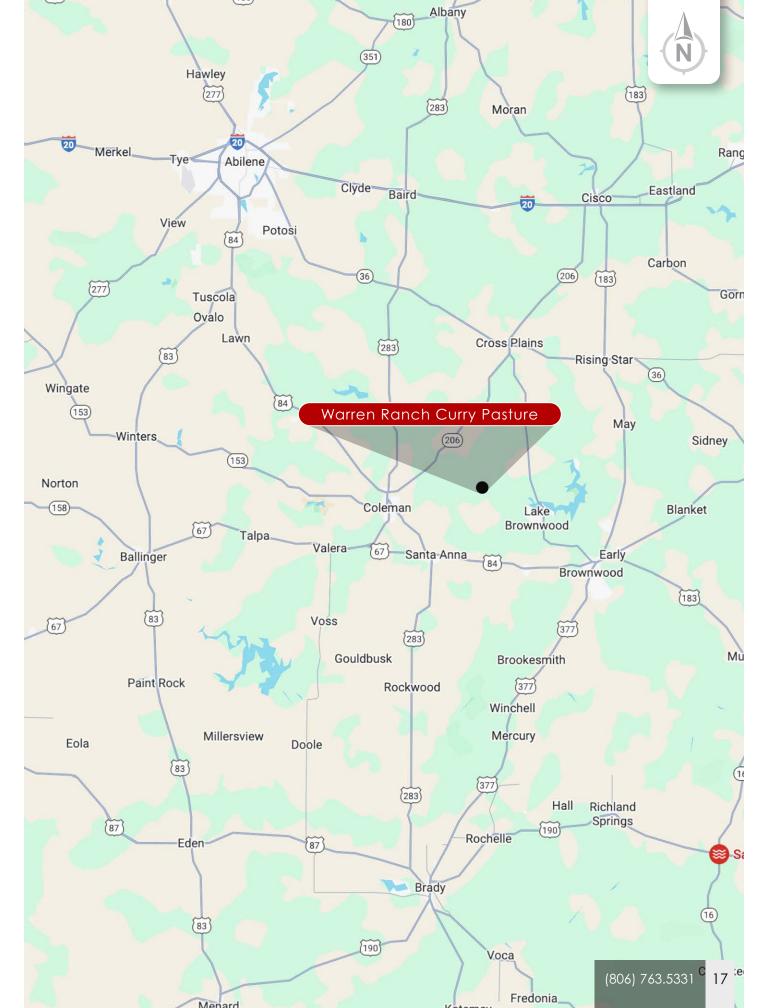
