MILFORD

The Milford Dam is operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). The reservoir has a surface area of 15,700 acres and an average depth of about 25 feet making it Kansas' largest reservoir.

Numerous camping and picnicking areas are maintained by the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, USACE, and the cities of Wakefield and Milford. Two privately-owned marinas are located on the lake, providing services for boaters and anglers.

Approximately 18,000 acres of public land surrounds Milford Reservoir on the west side and the upper end. This land is managed to support various wildlife species.

Numerous opportunities exist for those who wish to observe or photograph wildlife on the area. The abundant and diverse habitat is home to many nongame birds, mammals, reptiles, and aquatic life.

About the Park

Milford State Park is a 1,084-acre multipurpose recreation area located at the southeast end of Milford Reservoir.

Boaters, anglers, and water enthusiasts will find a full-service marina. Showers, two trailer dump stations, restrooms, boat ramps, picnic sites, and reservable single-family or large-group shelters are available.

The park features eight campgrounds with 84 campsites offering water and electric hookups and 55 sites with water, electric and sewer hookups. There are 102 primitive campsites available throughout the park. The park has 10 modern cabins for rent.

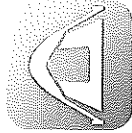

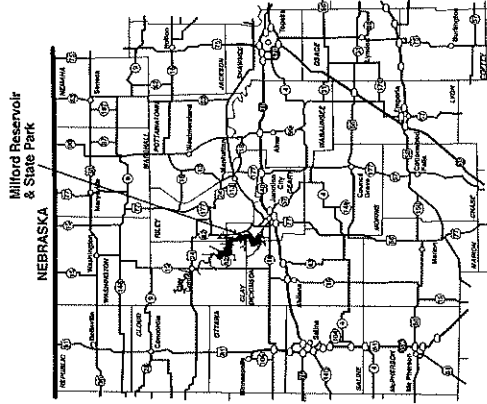
Things to Remember

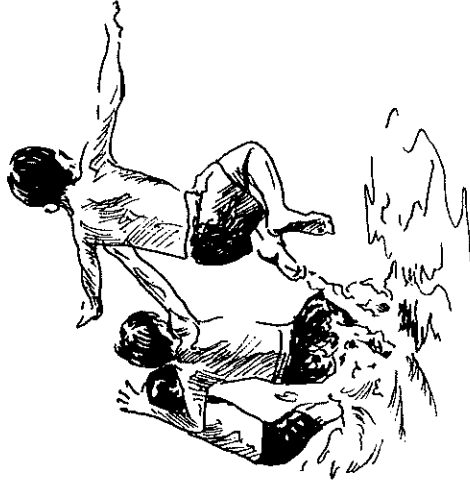

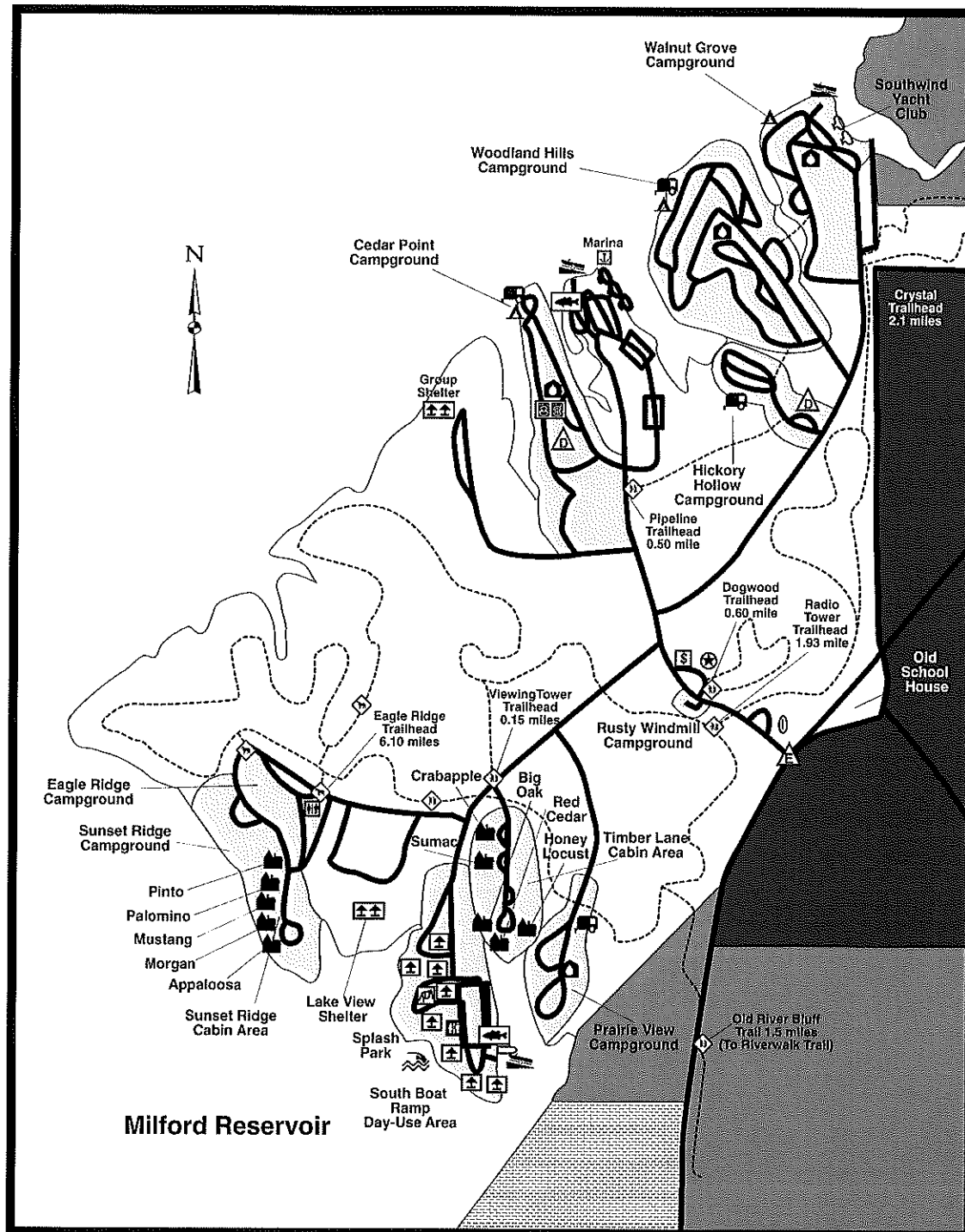
Wildlife

Many game species are present on Milford Wildlife Area. Known mainly for its quail and pheasant populations, the area also has huntable populations of turkey, deer, dove, squirrel, coyote, cottontail rabbits, prairie chicken, ducks, and geese. Though populations fluctuate from year to year, all of these species provide hunters with a challenging outdoor experience.

A permanent 1,103-acre wildlife refuge has been established on the northern end of the reservoir for waterfowl management. The public hunting areas and the refuge are clearly posted.

Milford Wildlife Area also provides thousands of acres for wildlife viewing by hikers and other area users.

We All Need To Help

Milford Lake is the largest lake in Kansas. Over 50% of our annual visitation occurs in the campgrounds. We need your help to protect the natural resources so that future trips to the lake are as rewarding as today's.

1. All campers must have a **reservation** to camp in Curtis Creek, sites are **100%** reservable. If you do not have a reservation please follow the instructions posted near the Fee Booth to make one. There is a phone available for use, located outside the Fee Booth. Please ensure you have a reservation in place **PRIOR** to setting up on a site.
2. ATVs, dirt bikes and golf carts are **prohibited** in the park. If you are bringing ATVs or dirt bikes to ride in School Creek ORV Park, then you must leave them trailered or loaded.
3. No driving on the grass at **any time**. Boat trailers (loaded or empty) may be backed onto the grass at your site. Extra vehicles may park parallel along the shoulder of the road to avoid obstructing traffic.

Quiet Hours are from 10 PM to 6 AM.

Visitors must leave by 9 PM.

Check out is at 6 PM.

4. Keep your site clean. Place all trash in the dumpsters. Recycle your aluminum cans at collection points for the Boy Scouts. They really appreciate it.
5. Pets must be on leashes at all times. Please respect other campers and clean up after your pet.
6. **SLOW DOWN!** You're here to relax and have a good time. Please observe the posted speed limits and watch out for the bicycle riders, walkers and children playing.
7. Firewood collection: only dead and down wood can be collected for fires. Standing dead trees are wildlife habitat and must be protected.



Curtis Creek

Located on a peninsula, bank fishing is a snap. At the public boat ramp, a wheelchair accessible floating fishing dock is also available. If you are a boater, there is a boat ramp located inside the campground.

Great views of the lake and dam, playgrounds, hot showers and flush restrooms make Curtis Creek a wonderful place for a family campout.

Curtis Creek campground is open from April 15 through September 30.
