

LEGAL DESCRIPTON

PARCEL "B" - 16.7363 ACRES

Lying and being in Nicholas County, Kentucky on the Southwest side of Mexico Road, being 1.60 miles East of Myers Road (Ky Route 32) and more particularly described as follows to-wit:

Unless otherwise stated, and monument referred to as an iron pin set is a 1/2" rebar, 18" in length with a pink stamped P.L.S. 3046. All bearings stated herein are referenced to US State Plane 1983, Kentucky Single Zone, Nad 1983, (Conus) Geoid 12A.

BEGINNING at a railroad spike set in the center of Mexico Road, a common corner to the Grantor and the Kentucky Department of Fish & Wildlife (DB. 124, PG. 85), said point is witnessed by an iron pin set at N 85 degrees 30 minutes 40 seconds E - 21.70 feet; thence with the center of said road for nineteen calls, S 30 degrees 22 minutes 20 seconds E - 29.37 feet; thence S 41 degrees 41 minutes 41 seconds E - 68.90 feet; thence S 34 degrees 25 minutes 54 seconds E - 41.78 feet; thence S 24 degrees 22 minutes 12 seconds E -53.42 feet; thence S 22 degrees 51 minutes 13 seconds E - 140.11 feet; thence S 20 degrees 34 minutes 18 seconds E - 54.11 feet; thence S 14 degrees 09 minutes 22 seconds E - 52.67 feet; thence S 08 degrees 55 minutes 50 seconds E - 78.22 feet to a railroad spike set in the center of Mexico Road; thence continuing with the center of said road, S 20 degrees 43 minutes 43 seconds E - 35.07 feet; thence S 43 degrees 46 minutes 12 seconds E - 31.36 feet; thence S 69 degrees 52 minutes 56 seconds E - 29.82 feet; thence N 87 degrees 51 minutes 04 seconds E - 30.83 feet; thence N 69 degrees 33 minutes 06 seconds E - 38.31 feet; thence N 60 degrees 44 minutes 04 seconds E - 122.26 feet; thence N 75 degrees 21 minutes 20 seconds E - 35.46 feet; thence S 82 degrees 08 minutes 50 seconds E - 28.49 feet; thence S 58 degrees 55 minutes 16 seconds E -29.73 feet; thence S 52 degrees 26 minutes 28 seconds E - 45.44 feet; thence S 63 degrees 48 minutes 48 seconds E - 32.85 feet to a railroad spike set in the center of Mexico Road, a corner to Bobby L. Fay (DB. 135, PG. 403); thence leaving the center of said road with the lines of Fay, S 08 degrees 13 minutes 54 seconds W -81.72 feet to an iron pin set; thence N 82 degrees 01 minutes 06 seconds W - 132.00 feet to a point in a hollow; thence S 87 degrees 10 minutes 12 seconds W - 53.15 feet to a 10" elm in hollow; thence S 63 degrees 54 minutes 54 seconds W - 246.99 feet to a 14" elm in hollow; thence s 83 degrees 48 minutes 30 seconds W -155.38 feet to a point in hollow; thence S 67 degrees 41 minutes 01 seconds W - 176.25 feet to a 36" sycamore in hollow; thence N 87 degrees 48 minutes 28 seconds W - 265.31 feet to a point in hollow; thence S 38 degrees 56 minutes 37 seconds W - 100.76 feet to a 42" sycamore in hollow; thence S 70 degrees 21 minutes 02 seconds W - 313.53 feet to a point in hollow; thence S 06 degrees 31 minutes 51 seconds E - 82.78 feet to a point in hollow; thence N 83 degrees 42 minutes 20 seconds W - 64.07 feet to a point in hollow; thence S 59 degrees 32 minutes 51 seconds W - 42.10 feet to a 14" twin water maple on North bank of hollow and the East bank of the Licking River; thence with the East bank of said Licking River, N 00 degrees 38 minutes 11 seconds E - 216.89 feet to point on bank; thence N 14 degrees 52 minutes 32 seconds E - 249.25 feet to a 24" twin water maple on the East bank; thence N 23 degrees 42 minutes 01 seconds E - 587.98 feet to a point on the East bank of the Licking River, a corner to the Kentucky Department of Fish & Wildlife (DB. 124, PG. 85); thence leaving the East bank of the Licking River with the line of Fish & Wildlife, passing thru an iron pin set at 51.00 feet, N 85 degrees 30 minutes 40 seconds E - a total distance of 554.35 feet to the place of beginning containing 16.7363 acres more or less and is exclusive of all other right of ways and easements of record.

The above description is in accordance with a new boundary survey made by Patrick A. McLafferty, P.L.S. 3046 on the 7th day of May, 2025.



National Flood Hazard Layer FIRMette





Regulations

Deer Season Restrictions:

Archery/crossbow: Prohibited on the main tract during the quota fox hunting field trials (September 10 - 13, 2025; September 24-26, 2025; February 25 - 28, 2026)

Modern Gun: Quota Hunt Only

Rabbit: Open November 1 – December 31, 2025, except closed on November 1-2, 2025 for the Deer Quota Hunt and in the Pheasant Quota Hunt Units during Pheasant Quota Hunts December 5-8, 2025.

Grouse and Quail: Open until 3 p.m. (local time) on Tuesdays and Saturdays from November 1 - December 31, 2025, except closed on November 1-2, 2025 for the Deer Quota Hunt and in the Pheasant Quota Hunt Units during Pheasant Quota Hunts December 5-8, 2025. Daily Bag Limit is four quail and two grouse.

Bear: Open Only in Bear Zone.

Other Restrictions:

Pheasant Quota Hunts: either sex, limit two, on December 5, 6 and 7, 2025; Open December 8, 2025 only to drawn pheasant quota hunters, either sex, limit three; Open December 9-31, either sex, daily limit three.

The main tract of the management area is closed to public use September 10-13, September 24-27, 2025; and February 25-28, 2026 except for those registered to participate in quota fox hunting field trials on those days.

During the pheasant quota hunt period, pheasant quota hunt units close to small game hunting for four consecutive days starting the first Friday in December. Rabbit, quail and grouse hunters must check in and check out at a self-service kiosk and clearly display a department-provided vehicle hang-tag in a vehicle. Hang-tags are available in advance through the department's website. Portions of this WMA in Fleming and Bath counties are Zone 3 for bear.

Directions & Description

Located approximately eight miles northeast of Carlisle, KY. From Carlisle take KY 32 north and turn right on KY 57, Cassidy Creek RD. There are two entrances, watch for area signs.

Terrain is steep to rolling. Several boat ramps provide access to the Licking River. Horseback riding trails on main Nicholas County tract only.

Upland Bird and Rabbit Hunters MUST check in/out at Kiosks using Hang Tag (last page of map document)

This WMA is closed to the public during quota fox hunting field trials. Owned by Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources, portions purchased with funds from the Heritage Lands Conservation Fund.

The LICKING RIVER (from Wikipedia)

(information about the Licking River is from Wikipedia): The Licking River is a partly navigable 303 mile long (488 km) tributary of the Ohio River in Northeastern Kentucky. The river and it's tributaries drain much of the region of northeastern Kentucky between the watersheds of the Kentucky River to the west and the Big Sandy River to the east. The North Fork Licking River, in Pendleton County, Kentucky, is one of it's tributaries. The South Fork Licking River, in counties including Harrison County, Kentucky, is another.

The River is considered by ecologists to provide a unique ecosystem in the region. The lower river is considered to be a habitat for the relatively rare native Muskellunge. The River basid supports several other fish species including: redside dace, mimic shiner, streamline chub, slender madtom, blue sucker, paddlefish and eastern sand darter. There are more than 50 species of freshwater mussels, 11 of which are endangered. The watershed provides wetland stopover habitats for about 250 species of migratory birds, an unusually high number. Several state and federal agencies, as well as private organizations such as The Nature Conservancy work to protect the diversity of this important habitat.
